Dr. Jesse Guscott, a Rural Generalist and award-winning Medical Educator, envisioned CGMH as a leader in rural medical education. He proposed a simulation-based training program tailored to the unique challenges of rural healthcare - with the long-term goal of sharing it with other rural healthcare providers and creating a sustainable revenue stream for CGMH.

"We are practicing the things that happen only occasionally, that are very dangerous, that are very high stakes, where decision-making, communication, leadership in the moment, is going to make a difference in patient outcomes." says Dr. Guscott.

Simulation training (similar to flight simulators in the aviation industry), allows healthcare professionals to safely practice clinical scenarios using high-fidelity mannequins and immersive settings. It builds confidence and bedside skills without risking patient safety.



What began in 2016 in an oversized closet at CGMH has grown into a nationally recognized program, training learners from across North America. From trauma simulations with live actors to the innovative SCORE (Simulating Crisis for Optimal Response in Emergencies) program, CGMH is setting a new standard in rural medical training.

As plans for Tomorrow's Hospital take shape, the simulation program will move into a purpose-built space, expanding its reach, leveraging newer technology, and continuing to prepare teams for the moments that matter most.





Thanks to incredible generosity of donors across South Georgian Bay, construction is nearly complete on our first ever Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI) Suite. This state-of-the-art, 2,000-square-foot renovation on the lower level of CGMH is now home to our first MRI Suite that is set to open in late fall 2025.

Once operational, the MRI will:

- Reduce travel for more than 11,000 local residents each year who currently leave the region for scans.
- **Shorten wait times** enabling faster diagnoses and more timely treatment decisions.
- **Enhance patient care** across the region by providing advanced imaging close to home.

Transforming an old office and meeting room to a fully equipped MRI Suite required careful planning and collaboration. Since December 2024, CGMH teams have worked closely with architects and engineers to meet strict space, electrical, and magnetic safety requirements. With limited space available, careful planning was key.

In July, this construction project reached a major milestone with the arrival of the MRI machine and the magnet chiller.

#### What's Next?

As we prepare for our first patients later this fall the new CGMH team is focused on:

- Final equipment installation
- System testing and commissioning
- Staff training

A skilled team of MRI Technologists and Radiologists will ensure the unit is ready to deliver safe, high-quality care as soon as possible.

This project is more than just a new service—it's an investment in CGMH's present and future. It meets urgent needs today while laying the groundwork for expanded diagnostic imaging in Tomorrow's Hospital, anticipated to begin construction in 2028.

Thank you for your continued support as we work together to bring expanded healthcare services to South Georgian Bay.



The Giving Circle gathered for its annual meeting on September 30th. This group of women, united in support of the CGMH Foundation, is dedicated to funding projects that make a real difference in the care patients receive at CGMH. Together, members not only give but also participate in a shared decision-making process that determines how their generosity is directed. Here are the projects that were presented at this year's meeting:

#### DXA Encode for Faster, Accurate Bone Mineral Density Assessments

This system simplifies intake, automates reporting, and keeps results aligned with evolving standards. It reduces delays and supports timely, accurate diagnosis and monitoring for patients.

#### Cognitive Behavioural Therapy Training for Psychosis for Enhancing Mental Health Care

This training combines evidence-based therapy with medical care to reduce patient hospitalizations and support their long-term stability. It empowers patients with insight and tools for managing hallucinations, delusions, and disorganized thinking, which helps in improving both recovery and quality of life.

#### **OMNI Hysteroscope for Better Outcomes in Women's Health**

This instrument set provides gynecologists with enhanced visibility and access for diagnosing and treating fibroids, polyps, and other conditions, while eliminating the need for open surgery, lowering risks and ensuring more effective patient care.

#### Bioelectrical Impedance Analysis Machine for Reducing Fracture Risk

With this equipment, our Orthopaedics team will be able to identify muscle loss before it leads to serious complications. They will also be able to support proactive treatment plans that protect mobility, reduce hospitalizations, and promote stronger aging in our community.

#### **Mindful Meals for Supporting Mental Health Through Food Security**

This is a pilot project creating a food pantry within the Mental Health building to serve outpatients facing food insecurity. Providing access to nutritious food, reduces stress, supports treatment, and promotes overall well-being.

## Matthew's Story of Survival and Gratitude at CGMH

Wasaga Beach realtor Matthew Zuccarini was on a routine drive through Collingwood when everything changed. Without warning, he was overcome by nausea and confusion. Unable to explain where he was, he called his wife, Amanda. Her quick thinking and a phone tracking app led emergency services straight to him.

By the time Amanda got to the scene, what had seemed like a panic attack quickly escalated. Matthew's heart rate surged to 278 beats per minute. He was rushed to CGMH, where he was met by a team of skilled healthcare professionals.

At CGMH, Matthew was placed under the care of Dr. Mike Randazzo, Chief of Internal Medicine. Moments after arriving in the Emergency Department, Matthew's heart stopped.

What happened next felt surreal. Matthew recalls hovering above his body, watching the medical team work, and feeling his late father gently guide him back to his body.

Matthew spent the next two weeks in CGMH's Intensive Care Unit. Understanding how much he missed his young son, the nursing team arranged a special visit in the hospital garden. That moment gave Matthew the strength to keep fighting. Just weeks after returning home, Amanda discovered she was expecting their second child - a daughter Matthew was able to meet, thanks to the swift and skilled response of CGMH's medical team.

"I should not have survived," Matthew says. "But because of CGMH, I did."

In May, the Zuccarinis invited Dr. Randazzo into their home to express their gratitude. Matthew later shared on social media, "This is the man that revived me from the brink of death... He's my angel on earth."

# Through the Lens of Service: Michael's Impact at CGMH



For many, a hospital visit can feel overwhelming. Now imagine being greeted by a volunteer whose warm smile and calm presence instantly put you at ease. That's Michael Gray Wheeler—a valued member of CGMH's volunteer team whose kindness and dedication leave a lasting impression.

After retiring in 2023, Michael and his wife chose Collingwood for its natural beauty and strong sense of community. Wanting to stay engaged, he joined CGMH as a volunteer and quickly took on multiple roles: Patient and Family Advisor, assisting in CT and X-ray, and supporting the welcome desk when needed.

Michael's comfort in a hospital setting comes from decades in healthcare IT. His career began in Montreal at the Jewish General Hospital while studying Media and Digital Imaging. Blending healthcare and photography sparked a passion that led him to become a clinical applications trainer and later a director with AGFA Healthcare, where he built training centres and worked with Radiologists, Clinicians, and Technologists across North America.

"I've been to hundreds of hospitals," Michael shares. "I used to do workflow assessments at large institutions like Boston General. I can tell you, CGMH is running incredibly well."

Michael's artistic side also shines at CGMH. The Foundation often invites him to capture special moments through his photography—something he finds deeply rewarding. "There are unique moments every day," he says. "If we slow down and train our eyes to see them, life becomes that much richer."

Beyond CGMH, Michael volunteers with Habitat for Humanity, Golden Rescue, and GTHS Marketing, continuing a legacy of service that began over 25 years ago with the Lions Club.

Michael's story reminds us how one person's talents and generosity can ripple through a community. His dedication—inside and outside CGMH—reflects the vibrant volunteer spirit that makes our hospital so special.
